Maths

Know 'times' and 'division' facts for 2, 5 and 10

Add and subtract 2 two-digit numbers (e.g. $48 + 35$; $72 - 17$)

Know all number bonds to and within 10 and use these to calculate bonds to 20 (e.g. if $7 + 3 = 10$ then $17 + 3 = 20$)

Identify fractions of a shape or number – halves, quarters and thirds

Read the time on a clock to the nearest 15 minutes

Home learning

Expectations for Year 3 - Tasks and timings

Read a book (20 minutes daily)

Multiplication practice (10 minutes daily) - pupils are meant to know all their times tables up to 12 by the end of Year 4

MyMaths task (30 minutes weekly) and Times Table Rock Stars

Bug Club – reading (15 minutes every day)

Half termly homework based around a word or phrase and linked to another subject (30-45 minutes)

Free school meals

All primary school children receive a free school meal in state-funded schools in London.

Primary school children will automatically get their free school meal whether their parent or carer gets a qualifying benefit or not, but it's very important that families on benefits still complete an application form for free school meals. **If you qualify, the free school meal entitlement will be protected until they reach the end of their primary school education, even if your circumstances change.**

Please download the form from the [local authority website](#) or call at the school office to collect an application form. Please apply if you think you may be entitled, even if your child does not want to have school dinners.
