

Add and subtract 2 two-digit numbers (e.g. 48 + 35; 72-17)

Know all number bonds to and within 10 and use these to calculate bonds to 20 (e.g. if 7 + 3 + 10 then 17 + 3 = 20)

Identify fractions of a shape or number – halves, quarters and thirds

Read the time on a clock to the nearest 15 minutes

Free school meals

From September 2023 until July 2024, all primary school children will receive a free school meal in state-funded schools in London.

Primary school children will automatically get their free school meal whether their parent or carer gets a qualifying benefit or not, but it's very important that families on benefits still complete an application form for free school meals. If you qualify, the free school meal entitlement will be protected until they reach the end of their primary school education, even if your circumstances change.

Please download the form from the <u>local authority website</u> or call at the school office to collect an application form. Please apply if you think you may be entitled, even if your child does not want to have school dinners.

Payments for school trips

We are a cashless school and therefore payments for trips should be made using ParentPay. Letters with account details will be sent home with your child in September.





Consent

After your Junior School place has been confirmed, you will be sent a link to a Google form. The Google form will contain information on:

- General consent for local trips, ICT rules, first aid and contact information (it is essential that we have at least two emergency contacts for your child)

Home learning

Pupils have a homework book but can pload their work. We have a homework club to support pupils with their homework.

Expectations for Year 3 - Tasks and timings

Read a book (20 minutes daily)

Multiplication practice (10 minutes daily) - pupils are meant to know all their times tables up to 12 by the end of Year 4

MyMaths task (30 minutes weekly) and Times Table Rock Stars

Bug Club – reading (15 minutes every day)

Weekly homework based around a word or phrase and linked to another subject (30-45 minutes)

Spelling (weekly)
