




How do we use the internet?








Sometimes it really isn't all fun and games


- The internet is a great resource but some users don't have the conduct that they might have in real life

How can we ensure respect and positive relationships online?

- Virtues and character
- Report inappropriate content or conversations
- Don't take part in negative behaviour
- Don't access sites or platforms that aren't age appropriate
- Think before you speak or type
- Stop if your emotions are heightened

Tips for respect and positive relationships online

- If you wouldn't say it in real life, it's probably offensive
- Don't share personal details about yourself or anyone else
- Don't engage in negative conversations
 - Don't allow your emotions to control you
 - Report inappropriate conversations or content
 - Don't use platforms or sites that aren't age appropriate
