Science Curriculum - Relationships, Sex and Health Education (RSE)

The school will be starting a short topic on bodies and relationships in the week beginning Monday 10 June as part of our Science and PSHE curriculum. It is important that all children learn about this in a safe and secure environment, which we provide at school, in an inclusive way. In RSE, we will be learning about our bodies, health and relationships with a particular focus on puberty and growing up, dealing with emotions and managing personal relationships.

During these lessons, pupils will be able to ask questions, which will be answered factually and in an age appropriate manner using scientific vocabulary. Lessons are taught by staff who are trained in delivering the specific content of the lessons.

Anti-Racism Lessons

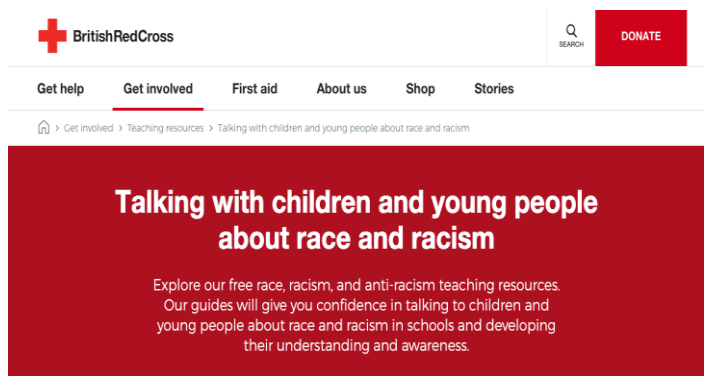
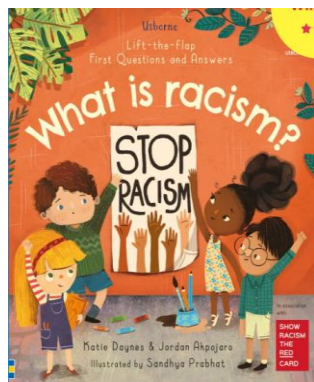
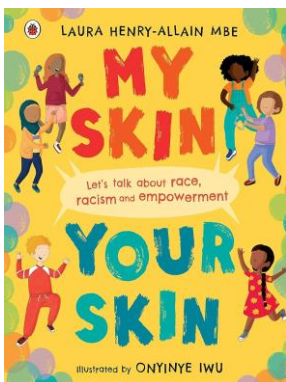
