#### **Measles Outbreak**

There have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands. There is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action to increase the uptake of the Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination.

Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best protection against measles, for children and adults, is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine. It is never too late to have these vaccinations.
