# **World Book Day Celebrations**




We are celebrating World Book Day on Friday 3 March at Carterhatch Juniors.

The artwork can be made using any material; it can be a painting, sculpture, photograph, installation, video, drawing, or a combination. You must have some information about it such as title, size and a little bit about the artwork and why you made it.

Once we submit your artwork, it will be seen by a panel of judges at the Royal Academy of Arts and the selected pieces will be shown on their online exhibition. Some of the artworks will also be shown at the Royal Academy of Arts.
