World Book Day - Friday 8 March

BOOK DAY Paul Lyalls, a poet will be joining us on our World Book Day. He has been poet in residence for the Roald Dahl Museum and has worked with Michael Rosen, Arsenal FC and Benjamin Zephaniah. The school will be fully covering the cost of his visit, when every year group will have workshops with him – so no charge to parents/carers.

Pupils will have the chance to read their library book with other pupils from their school family (Citrine, Emerald and Garnet). We are not asking pupils to dress up as book characters, but just to wear comfortable clothes to relax and read books during the day. They can also bring in a cushion/blanket/slippers (to change into) for their shared reading time. Parents and carers - you do not have to worry about making or buying costumes.

Pupils will also have the chance to have Paul's poetry book signed at the end of the day, please order through the school office by next Monday 26 February, at the latest.

World Book Day - Book Swap on 8 March
