
Welcome back to school. It has been lovely seeing the pupils again and it's now back to work—they have all made an enthusiastic start to Spring term.

How to apply for free school meals

Use the web link below to apply. You will be asked to enter your postcode and you will be directed to the website of your local council https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals. You will then be asked to fill in an online form, with details about your family and children, such as dates of birth, name of school, year group and your National Insurance number. Please add ALL children in the family to the same form. You can then submit the application.

ScholarPack App

We use the ScholarPack Parents App to communicate with parents rather than sending text messages which incur additional costs to the school. The app is available free of charge on Apple and Google app stores.

If you are already using the ScholarPack App and you have a red notification which won't clear, please check you are using the latest version of the App. Also try clearing the cookies/cache.
